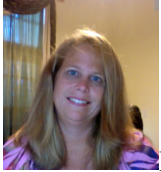
Words from the Advisors:

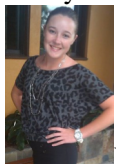

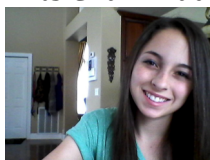

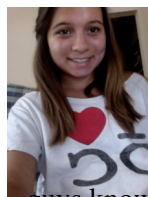
Arts Chair Maddy Rabil:

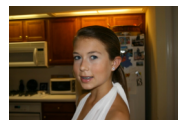
Vice President: Sarah Molina
